

Emergency Response Booms & Cleaner

- 1. Gather up Shredders, stick and wood shredders. works ok...have knowing Operators begin Shredding Rubber materials: Careful...wet the rubber just before shredding...it helps to chop clean.**

Tires....Old Michelins, lotz of Natural Rubber in them.

Foamed Rubber...carpet backing (not the carpet though)

NO Paper or Cardboard....becomes saturated, waterlog and sinks. Not Good.

Latex Foam Carpet backing, or Urethane Foam.

Rubber Mulches- Use as is or shred an blend,

Styrofoam Plastics. Foamed Boards, packaging Peanuts, Egg Cartons, Meat Trays...anything Styrofoam...Shred only COARSE...not fine.

Chunk out Tires around the dia. As a Silver Dollar.

Roofing Membranes and scraps....Made from EPDM Rubber...soaks up huge qty's Petroleum Oil...

Line the bottom of a Long Netting with strips of Carpet Backing Foams...add in the other rubber Shred.

Lay these on tethered anchors into the approach of the Wetlands areas....Marshes River Mouths, Inland Waterways areas.

The Crude will be deflected and partially absorbed by these Emergency Booms. Natural Soap sprays in and around the protected areas. Will help prevent Oil from coating Flags, Reeds such. Non-Toxic and No Surfactants or chemicals. Suggest use of Amway Corporations LOC Regular diluted 1 part LOC to 14 volumes of good water.... or Sea water. Weed Sprayers should be used...use this to also clean along the shorelines....it will assist in removing the film caused by the Aromatic Hydrocarbons and Benzenes in the Crude Oil. Willards XXX 3%. If one obtains and peppers the entire shoreline with Lignite Coal....just pebbles sized...this helps detoxify the Benzenes. Please check back, time to time...Pas this on to the next Community up the Shoreline.
